LEHI, Utah (UPI) - A search party Friday night reached the wreckage of a plane missing one week with seven Houston, Tex., residents aboard. There were no survivors.

The plane was on its way from Houston to the Mormon General Conference in Salt Lake City when it van-

ished Sept. 30 after a refueling stop in Farmington, N.M.

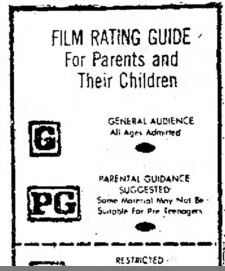
Federal Aviation Administration officials in Salt Lake said bad weather in the area on the day of the disappearance could have obscured the mountains and contributed to the crash.

Piloted by Robert Butterworth, 25, the Cherokee Six also carried Terry Way, 30, Cary Holt, 28, Jan Williamson, 25, Maxine Ferguson, 22, Thomas Hunt, 22, and Bob Marsin, in his late 20s.

The plane was the object of a massive air and ground search in four states. Civil Air Patrol officials said Friday night that scores of volunteer pilots who flew search grids in Utah, Colorado, New Mexico and Arizona would be sent home today.

The bodies were brought

down from the crash site Friday night by horseback.
