FROM THE MAYOR'S DESK

IT'S BACK TO SCHOOL MONTH AND THE CITY IS EXCITED TO WELCOME OUR NEWEST SCHOOL, MOUNTAIN TRAILS ELEMENTARY IN CITY CENTER. WE ARE ALSO EXCITED TO OPEN VISTA HEIGHTS MIDDLE SCHOOL IN SARATOGA SPRINGS WHERE OUR MIDDLE SCHOOL AGED CHILDREN WILL BE ATTENDING.

One of the great things about the City's new curbside recycling program is that Ace Disposal is donating 20% of their profits from the recycling to our local elementary schools. We will be meeting with each of the schools to discuss what their needs are and make plans to evenly distribute the monies to each school. We appreciate Ace giving back to our community.

We are also gearing up for fall sports. I am happy to announce we are beginning construction on the next phase of Mid-Valley Regional Park (located on Sweetwater Road south of Unity Pass). This next phase will include a baseball four-plex and two soccer fields. Sod is expected to be placed by the

end of September. Games will begin next spring.

Improvements will also begin on the Smith Ranch Park. Located adjacent to Pony Express Elementary, this phase will include a parking area and sod which can accommodate two soccer fields.

Another park improvement in the works is a splash pad to be installed at Nolan Park. This location was chosen because of the existing bathrooms. The splash pad is expected to be completed and ready for use by next summer.

Continuing to improve our parks and recreation opportunities is important to me. Much of what we have been able to do the last couple of years has been due to the assistance of our federal representatives and grants we have received.

Last month I traveled to Washington D.C. to meet with some of

If it is not life threatening but you need to report something or you need to talk to a deputy or Fire/EMS, call non-emergency dispatch at 851-4100. If you need fingerprints, a police report, or to schedule a tour, please call 789-6701 during city business hours.

Changes to **Utility Rates**



During our yearly Budget Prepara-

tion, the City reviewed its programs and funds. As a result, the City realized the need to add a Storm Drain Fee for the maintenance of storm drains. The charge will be \$3.00 per home. At the same time, the City evaluated the funds available for certain utilities and we feel we can safely reduce \$1.00 from our Electric base rate and \$2.00 from our Sewer base rate for all our residents.

Timpanogos Special Service District has notified the City they will be raising the Sewer rate by \$4.50 for our North Service Area (The Ranches & SilverLake). As a result of this change, the North Sewer rate will be \$38.00 per month. The South Service Area (City Center) rate is \$43.00 per month. If you have any questions please call 801-789-6609.

Finally, Eagle Mountain City business owners should have received a letter from the City detailing a recent decision by the city council to establish a tiered water rate for commercial and institutional utility customers. An application is reguired to use the tiered water rates. Please visit the Utilities page of the city website for an application and/or more information.



Westlake High Grad Receives **Congressional Award**

Ashleigh O'Connor, a 2010 graduate of Westlake High and Miss Eagle Mountain contestant has been awarded the Silver Congressional Award.

The Congressional Award is the United States Congress' award for young Americans. It is non-partisan, voluntary, and non-competitive. The program is open to all 14- to 23year-olds. Participants earn Bronze, Silver and Gold Congressional Award Certificates and Bronze, Silver and Gold Congressional Award Medals. Each level involves setting goals in four program areas; Volunteer Public Service, Personal Development, Physical Fitness, and Expedition/ Exploration. The youth are honored for achieving their own challenging goals.

O'Connor completed hundreds of hours in each of the program areas. Her accomplishments included increasing awareness about breast cancer by organizing a dance fundraiser at Westlake High, putting together a platform

for the Miss Eagle Mountain Pageant that benefitted pediatric cancer, and improving her dance ability and physical fitness by continuing her dance education.

Inspired by her parents, who both earned the Congressional Award in their youth, O'Connor says she is proud to follow in their footsteps.

"I would encourage young people to get this award," O'Connor said, "It really helped me grow as a person."

Previously awarded with the Bronze, O'Connor is currently working on the Gold. If she earns the Gold she will be eligible to travel to Washington D.C. to receive the award there.

An August Safety reminder from your fire department. Please be aware of our children's return to school by doing the following:

- Heed all school zones speeds
- Children in crosswalks should have the right of way, however not all of our children use the cross walks
- Review safety practices with your children so that we have a safe start of school.

Other safety reminders:

- Check your furnace before winter use
- Keep your clothes dryer lint collector clean and free from extreme buildup
- Always be smart when using alternative heating devices to make sure that the area is vented properly
- Remember when we change our clocks to change your smoke detector batteries.


