FROM THE MAYOR'S DESK

I CAN HARDLY BELIEVE WE ARE IN THE LAST MONTH OF SCHOOL AND GETTING READY FOR SUMMER. SUMMER BRINGS NEW PROJECTS INTO OUR CITY.

We have received 37 building permits in the month of April. Growth is certainly occurring here in Eagle Mountain. We are prepared to see those numbers continue to rise throughout the summer.

Have you noticed the dirt moving around SilverLake? A new plat was approved and construction is starting. This is the first new subdivision that we have seen in several years. We are currently starting the process with several other development projects and look forward to seeing them progress.

Ridley's Market has submitted for their building permit, and we are moving ahead! There will be several aspects of construction for this project that you will see; gas lines, power, water, sewer, as well as roads that are affected by bringing business into the community.

We are finishing up the budget process for our next fiscal year. We will adopt the tentative budget on May 7 and schedule the public hearing for May 21. Please come and make comment in our meeting or send us an email so that we might know what your concerns, questions, thoughts and preferences are regarding next year's budget.

Last month the City Council approved changes to our gas and electric rates. We received our completed rate study from Sawvel and followed their recommendations for the following rate changes: gas consumption rates were reduced from \$8 to \$6.74 per dekatherm, which is a 15.75% decrease. This decrease takes effect immediately. The electric consumption rate will increase in November, from .0995 to .10459 per kilowatt which is a 5.1% increase. The net effect of the two rate changes is a decrease of 10.65%. We also changed the base rates for gas and electric. The base rate for gas was \$16 per month and is now \$9.47, a decrease of 40.8% effective immediately. The base rate for electric is \$9 and will become \$10.14 per month, an increase of 12.7%. The electric base rate goes into effect November 1. The net effect of the base rate changes is a 28.1% decrease. If you have guestions regarding how this will specifically affect your bill, we have posted a utility rate calculator on the Utilities page of the City website.



Mayor Jackson presented the 2013 Woman of the Year Award at the Miss EM Pageant to Wendy Komoroski. A longtime EM resident and business owner, Komoroski serves on the Planning Commission and The Ranches Homeowners Association Design & Review Committee.

I want to recognize the great support we are receiving in preparation for Pony Express Days. We have over 50 volunteers to help with the rodeo, and 15 volunteers to help with the other events. We also have an army of volunteers from some local businesses like Walmart, Home Depot, Sherwin Williams, and Horrocks Engineering. We appreciate all of the support we receive from the community. Don't forget that several of our events are put on by our local schools, charities and clubs. We love that we can help find ways to give back to our community and support one another.


