The meeting will be attended by staff members of the PRC (non-elected officials), the Utah Department of Corrections, the Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice, and the PRC's consulting team.

Water Conservation/Restricted Hours

Eagle Mountain City is a member of the Central Utah Water Conservancy District. The District website at www.cuwcd.com is a good resource for conservation tips, as well as providing information on free gardening/landscaping classes, kids' classes, events, and concerts. Irrigation product rebates are also available. Conservation is always important, but it is especially important this year with the low snowpack.

The City follows recommended conservation methods. In spring months the irrigation systems operate at a reduced capacity and are increased as temperatures get hotter. The City and The Ranches HOA will be working together to do what we can to reduce the amount of water on roads and fix any malfunctioning areas of the system in a timely manner.

Please be aware that per City code, operation of irrigation systems between the hours of 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. daily is prohibited. Penalty for violating the code is first a written warning and second, termination of water service until a \$100 reconnection charge is paid to the City.

We encourage everyone to do what you can to conserve water and help prevent the necessity for severe water restrictions in the summer months.
