WITH RAPID GROWTH CONTINUING IN EAGLE MOUNTAIN, TWO NEW SCHOOLS ARE INCLUDED IN THE ALPINE SCHOOL DISTRICT BOND ON THE GENERAL ELECTION BALLOT NOVEMBER 8.

A high school and an additional elementary school (in the SilverLake area) are part of the \$387 million Alpine School District bond, which voters will decide on. Information about the bond resolution may be found at <http://alpineschools.org/bond2016/>.

There are no municipal candidates on the ballot but, in case you hadn't heard, this is a Presidential Election year. I'd like to encourage everyone to exercise your right to vote and participate in the process.

Following is some voter information I hope will be of help to you.

- [Register to Vote](#) – Online forms must be submitted at least 7 days before an election. If sent by mail, it must be postmarked a least 30 days before an election to be eligible to vote in that election.
- [Early Voting](#) – Early voting will be offered October 25 through November 4. All eligible voters can vote early at any of these locations at the link above.
- [Absentee Ballot](#) – Any registered voter who wishes to vote an absentee ballot must request an application. The completed application must be received no later than the Thursday before Election Day. A ballot will be



Eagle Mountain City, with help from UFA and UCSO EM Division, welcomed home several members of the Utah Army National Guard's 116th Engineering Company following a ten month deployment to Kuwait, Iraq, Afghanistan, Egypt, and United Arab Emirates.

According to the Utah Army National Guard, in total, the 116th Engineer Company completed more than 50 construction projects and 15 work orders valuing in excess of \$5,000,000. Highlights of their work in the region included construction of a dirt landing strip capable of supporting C-130 aircraft in support of special operations; repair and extension of another runway to make it capable of handling larger C-17 Globemaster aircraft; construction, in partnership with the Kuwait military, of more than 15 miles of anti-tank ditch along the Kuwait-Iraq border, removing more than 516,000 cubic yards of material in the process; and completion of the ground work and force protection requirements to reconfigure and improve Kandahar Airfield's main entry control point.
