I've been extremely disappointed since moving to Silverlake 3 years ago to see that this area doesn't seem to prioritize these things in the same way and to see the city put all its resources into maintaining Cory Wride Park instead of building and maintaining more pocket parks and trails that are

accessible to more people.

I would like it to look better than it currently does. I would think trails and an improved space would be wonderful, it will make the area more appealing and give residents more space to get out and walk and bike, but would love to maintain the beauty and home for the animals.

I would love to see the Gulch improved upon while still maintaining the natural elements of the area so we don't impede in the plants and animals that may thrive there. But it would be nice to see it also be a nature reserve with walking trails and other areas that the community can use to enjoy the natural elements of the area.

It certainly must be determined by its location and availability. For example, Cedar Pass Ranch owners own that section of the gully and are responsible for it. I live in Cedar Pass Ranch and a section near my home is threatening to cave-in and undercut into my pasture. A few years ago, a city worker offered to dump dirt down the deep poles there, which would be helpful. I do think it would be nice to have city owned sections that were available for exploration and very limited encroachment.

Natural preservation with limited recreation space (no more than 25% used for

recreation).

Currently it feels dumpy with tumbleweeds and crumbly dirt. It would be nice to have improved landscaping (prairie grasses, wild flowers, smaller trees, not grass) with walking trails. I do not want to see it become a place for four wheelers and off road recreation. I would also like to see a few more access points for cars across the wash.

The attraction to the Gulch is its natural conditions as they are, right now. This could be improved by monitoring illegal activities (dumping, loitering of kids under "age", etc...) and possible "minor" rehab or improvements. This is a two-edged sword, though - if the Gulch were to be too attractive, the larger draw of people would be detrimental, I think...

Clean up trash, garbage and leave it alone.

The wash is a natural corridor for the travel of wild animals. We have foxes living in the wash on the north side of the highway, for instance. My concern if you open it up for recreation is that both the corridor for migration, as well as for run-off during storm events will be eroded or changed enough to disrupt both. It should be preserved as it occurs naturally--or restored to its original state.

We live in North Ranch, for us, the Gulch is very deep so it is somewhat unusable, it's just a beautiful natural feature.

Although I have not been familiar any specific issues concerning this area, my general beliefs are that we should try to maintain natural landscapes as much as possible. This does require some maintenance, possibly some improvement, and definitely some limits placed on it, but in the least invasive way and as little regulated as possible.

I live right up against the gulch on silver ridge rd and we have a large flat area behind our house that was supposed to be maintained by the city according to Flagship. It's supposed to have a walking path built. Of course, neither flagship nor the city will do anything about the fact that it's just a ton of weeds that grow uncontrollably. And even though nobody takes care of it, we got in trouble for parking our truck back there , putting a trailer there, etc. it doesn't make any sense that we would get a warning for these things when the city does literally nothing to maintain it. The reason we were given for nothing being parked back there is because it stopped the growth of the natural vegetation... what? You mean the huge amount of ugly weeds? Made no sense and was annoying but we complied anyways. We've even gone back and plowed down the weeds behind a few houses ourselves just to make it nicer. The point of this is, I think the city should take care of these areas right behind people's houses (including the huge space next to the middle set of mailboxes on silver ridge rd) before moving on to another commitment."

A space where people and animals can both meet their needs. Some management is probably needed due to the growth of our population and the natural erosion of the wash from use and weathering. I don't think another bike park so close to the power line park is necessary, we ride bikes and love the trails and parks, but that kind of feature would be a deterrent to wildlife from using the area. For example, Yellowstone National Park is managed, but with animals and nature as its primary concern, not human activity. The gulch needs to survive as the flood path it is, but also for the benefit of the animals that live there. Improvements should be made to rectify what humans have already destroyed, and education of city residents needs to be a top priority to keep the gulch as natural as possible. Residents should be able to enjoy the gulch, but not allowed to destroy the natural beauty of it with vehicles, off road or off path activities or playgrounds. Visiting the gulch ought to be a quiet peaceful experience for all, so that everyone who visits can appreciate the natural beauty surrounding them.

Lots of green grass and trees. A paved path next to a bark/mulch path. Maybe even a seasonal 3D archery course IN the wash.

You shouldn't have let developers ruin the wash and ruin the native owls nest.

Enhance the natural state of the gulch and keep limited human disturbance to the edges.

Resection nature

Have it be cleaned up, but in as natural a state as possible, humans don't need to use the gulch

Leave it as is so that no more wildlife homes are ruined.

We do not need to alter this area. Leave it natural for the wildlife in the area. I see teenagers going down there and hiding and looking like they are getting into trouble. I would love to see the space turned into usable land with trails and paths, park furniture. I would love an escape to nature so close to home I would like it to stay as natural looking as possible but am in favor of making it accessible to use as well.

But it would be nice to see it also be a nature reserve with walking trails and other areas that the community can use to enjoy the natural elements of the area.

It certainly must be determined by its location and availability. For example, Cedar Pass Ranch owners own that section of the gully and are responsible for it. I live in Cedar Pass Ranch and a section near my home is threatening to cave-in and undercut into my pasture. A few years ago, a city worker offered to dump dirt down the deep poles there, which would be helpful. I do think it would be nice to have city owned sections that were available for exploration and very limited encroachment.

Speaking of this, I think the city should add juniper trees to a lot of the unimproved areas in eagle mountain. They grow naturally, provide diversity to the landscape. I'm not sure what it is but a nice recreational area would be nice to have It would make another nice place to walk or ride a bike.

Although I have not been familiar any specific issues concerning this area, my general beliefs are that we should try to maintain natural landscapes as much as possible. If the space is not suitable for building (residential or commercial), it should be preserved as much as possible. I believe whoever owns the land (be it city, state, or HOA) should try to maintain the integrity of the land to be used as it is in its natural state. This does require some maintenance, possibly some improvement, and definitely some limits placed on it, but in the least invasive way and as little regulated as possible.

And even though nobody takes care of it, we got in trouble for parking our truck back there , putting a trailer there, etc. it doesn't make any sense that we would get a warning for these things when the city does literally nothing to maintain it. The reason we were given for nothing being parked back there is because it stopped the growth of the natural vegetation... what? You mean the

huge amount of ugly weeds? Made no sense and was annoying but we complied anyways. We've even gone back and plowed down the weeds behind a few houses ourselves just to make it nicer. The point of this is, I think the city should take care of these areas right behind people's houses (including the huge space next to the middle set of mailboxes on silver ridge rd) before moving on to another commitment."

A space where people and animals can both meet their needs. Some management is probably needed due to the growth of our population and the natural erosion of the wash from use and weathering. I don't think another bike park so close to the power line park is necessary, we ride bikes and love the trails and parks, but that kind of feature would be a deterrent to wildlife from using the area. The gulch should be seen as a natural environment that needs to remain as natural as
possible. The city ought to take the national park service as it's model for
preserving this space. For example, Yellowstone National Park is managed, but with

survive as the flood path it is, but also for the benefit of the animals that live
there. Improvements should be made to rectify what humans have already destroyed,
and education of city residents needs to be a top priority to keep the gulch as
natural as possible. Residents should be able to enjoy the gulch, but not allowed to
destroy the natural beauty of it with vehicles, off road or off path activities or

Nature park where manageable and mostly unimproved otherwise
